THE STORY OF THE PASSOVER

Why is this night different from all other nights?

“On that same night I will pass through Egypt and strike down every firstborn – both men and animals – and I will bring judgment on all the gods of Egypt. I am the Lord. The blood will be a sign for you on the houses where you are; and when I see the blood, I will pass over you. No destructive plague will touch you when I strike Egypt.” Exodus 12:12-13 (NIV)

THE SECOND CUP - THE CUP OF PLAGUES

THE PASSOVER MEAL

THE LORD'S SUPPER

“You’ve no idea how much I have looked forward to eating this Passover meal with you before I enter my time of suffering. It’s the last one I’ll eat until we all eat it together in the kingdom of God.’ Taking the cup, he blessed it, then said, ‘Take this and pass it among you. As for me, I’ll not drink wine again until the kingdom of God arrives.’ Taking bread, he blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, ‘This is my body, given for you. Eat it in my memory.’ He did the same with the cup after supper, saying, ‘This cup is the new covenant written in my blood, blood poured out for you.’” Luke 22:15-20 (MSG)

THE HIDDEN BREAD - THE AFIKOMEN

“This is my body, which is given for you.”

THE THIRD CUP - THE CUP OF REDEMPTION

“I will redeem you with an outstretched arm...”

“This cup is the new covenant in my blood ...”

THE FOURTH CUP - THE CUP OF HALEL

“I will take you as my own people, and I will be your God.”

“I have wanted so much to eat this Passover meal with you before I suffer! For I tell you, I will never eat it until it is given its full meaning in the Kingdom of God.” Luke 22:15-16 (TEV)
