"And behold a certain lawyer stood up and tested Jesus saying, 'Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said, 'What is written in the law? What is your reading of it?' So he answered and said, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your strength and with all your mind; and love your neighbor as yourself.' And he said to him, 'You've answered rightly. Do this and you will live.' But he, wanting to justify himself to Jesus said, 'Who is my neighbor?' Jesus answered and said, 'A certain man went down from Jerusalem to Jericho, fell among thieves who stripped him of his clothing, wounded him, departed, left him half dead. Now by chance a certain priest came down that road. When he saw him he passed by on the other side. Likewise a Levite, when he arrived at the place, gave a look, passed by on the other side. But a certain Samaritan came where he was. When he saw him he had compassion. So he went to him, bandaged his wounds, poured on oil and wine, set him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, took care of him and on the next day when he departed he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper and said, 'Take care of him. And whatever more you spend when I come again, I will repay you.' So which of these three do you think was neighbor to him who fell among the thieves?' And he said, 'He who showed mercy on him.' And Jesus said to him, 'Go and do likewise.'"
